

The meta prompt mentioned you were looking for a common crossword entry that was hinted at four times in the grid. I think most solvers realized pretty quickly that there were pairs of repeating letters in each of the 4 corners (OTE, OLL, AME, USH). If you got that far, you were most of the way done! You just had to realize that the entries that contained those repeating letters rhymed, and the words on the outsides of these blocks (both above and below) also rhymed. In each of the corners, the order of the rhyming entries (aka the rhyme scheme) was **ABBA**, which is indeed a common crossword entry, and it also fit the the title. "Hear We Go Again" was referencing the Mamma Mia movies - which the band ABBA is intricately connected to, and the "hear" part was a hint that the sounds of the entries were important.
